

Sharon Henry, M.D., F.A.C.S., is the Anne Scalea Professor of Trauma Surgery at the University of Maryland School of Medicine, is a trauma surgeon at the R Adams Cowley Shock Trauma Center.

Dr. Henry came to the University of Maryland School of Medicine and the R Adams Cowley Shock Trauma Center in 1997, where she is currently an attending trauma surgeon/intensivist and director of the Center's Division of Wound Healing and Metabolism.

Dr. Henry received a Bachelor of Arts degree in 1981 at Duke University in Durham, North Carolina. She then returned to Maryland to attend medical school and received her medical degree from the University of Maryland School of Medicine in 1985. Her residency training was at State University of New York's Health Science Center at Brooklyn where she began her academic career after completing a critical care fellowship at the University of Minnesota in 1991.

Since joining the faculty at the R A Cowley Shock Trauma center, in addition to her duties and interests in injury care she was named the chief of the division of wound healing and metabolism service. Dr. Henry has been active in the Maryland Committee on Trauma serving as chair from 2004-2010. She served on the ACS central COT and was chair of the ATLS subcommittee 2013-2018. She was the ATLS global program chair until 2022. She was on the board of managers of the AAST from 2017-2021 and was a part of the senior visiting surgeon program in 2009 to Landstuhl Germany. She is also a member of the federal Trauma critical care team. She chaired the outreach subcommittee of the AAST's Diversity, Equity and Inclusion committee from 2021-2023 and co-chairs the American Trauma Society's DEI taskforce. She is the current vice chair of the AAST.
